Daily Prayer This Week

This week, let us be a Church between Ascension and Pentecost - sensing Jesus has gone before us and longing for the gifts of the Holy Spirit. The invitation for us is to pray to the Father this week, as Jesus did. We pray through the desires churning around in our hearts. Getting in touch with those desires will bring us closer to preparation for celebrating Pentecost. Naming what we long for, will place us with Jesus, praying to the Father for help.

Of course, it can be tender and quite personal, speaking to our Father with a Jesus-given intimacy. And, what makes it concrete, real, and a prayer from the heart of each of us, is that we are letting all of this interact with the real things in our everyday life.

It may come easily, spontaneously, as I'm getting dressed or in any of the "background times" of my day. But, it may be difficult for me to know how to address the Father. Perhaps my father-memories aren't warm and tender. All we have to do is relax and try it. We will meet a Father who loves us and longs for us to be relaxed and speak heart-to-heart. It can start with a dialogue with myself, e.g., where I ask myself questions and then answer myself.

What am I feeling? What fears can I name? What anxieties, worries come to me as I try to get in touch with what's going on right now? Who comes to my mind? Who is struggling? With whom am I in conflict? Am I frustrated? Tired? Feeling taken for granted? Where am I 'cutting corners,' or cheating or lying to myself or others? What's missing? What am I hungry for? What am I dreaming about? What is giving me joy?

The desires that flow from my answers to these questions shape our daily prayer this week. We find that we have plenty to talk with the Father about and ask for. Perhaps we can pray:

*Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful
and enkindle within them the fire of your love.
Send forth your Spirit and we shall be re-created and
join you in renewing the face of the earth.*

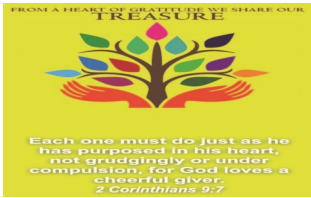
Catechism Themes: Christ already reigns through his Church (CCC 668-670) & Until all things are subject to him. (CCC 671-672)

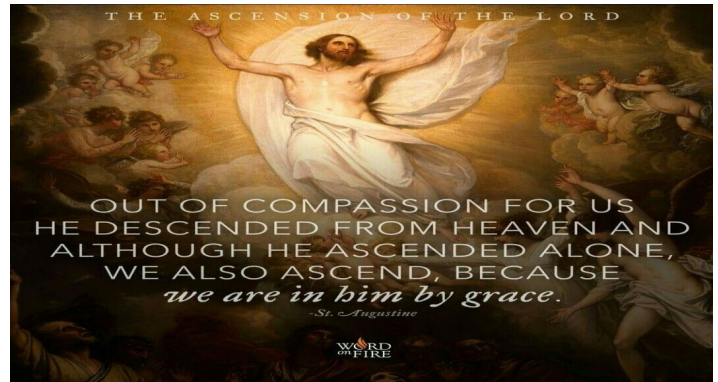

CONTACT TRACING IN OUR ICP CHURCH

We will be implementing procedures to help with contact tracing in the unfortunate event one of our parishioners or a visitor to our Church contracts the Corona Virus.

For your safety and in order to avoid closure of the Church, the Parish Pastoral Council has suggested the following contact tracing procedures that will be implemented this week. Everyone attending Mass will be identified. This includes people in the Church, the Parish Hall or seated outside.

- o Names and phone numbers for parishioners who regularly attend Mass and use their Church envelopes have been added to a Master List. As you enter Church next weekend, you will simply give your name and number of people attending Mass to the volunteer who will note your attendance.
- o If you are a regular attendee at Mass but do not use a Church envelope, as you exit the Church today, a volunteer will hand out a paper for you to fill out with your name and phone number to bring back to Mass next week. Next week you will give this to one of the volunteers before entering the Church.
- o Once we get this contact information, we will add you to the Master List and for subsequent weeks when attending Mass you can simply check in before Mass by giving the volunteer your name.
- o If for some reason you lose or forget to bring back the contact paper next weekend, we will have you fill out one before entering the Church.
- o If you are a visitor we will have you sign in on a Visitor Log.

Parish Council wanted to make it perfectly clear that these new procedures are in no way an attempt to get personal information about you and your family or to track and see if you are attending Mass regularly but are only being implemented to identify who is at a given Mass in the event we have a COVID-19 case here in the Church. We are looking for volunteers for this new ministry. If you are interested, please contact the Parish Office or Father Edison.
