# Today's Readings Reflection

The central theme of today's readings is "The Day of the Lord" or the "Second Coming" of Jesus in glory, as Judge, at the end of the world.

**Malachi, in the first reading,** foretells this day, which will bring healing and reward for the just and punishment in fire for the "proud and all evil doers."

Although St. Paul expected that Jesus would return during his lifetime, he cautions the Thessalonians, in the second reading, against idleness in anticipating the end of the world.

<u>Today's Gospel passage</u> underlines the truth that the date of the end of the world is uncertain. Signs and portents will precede the end, and the Christians will be called upon to testify before kings and governors.



#### Life messages:

1) We must be prepared daily for our death and private judgment.

We make this preparation by trying to do God's will every day, leading holy lives of self-less love, trust in God, mercy, compassion, and unconditional forgiveness.

In order to do this, we must recharge our spiritual batteries every day by personal prayer, that is, by talking to God, and by listening to Him through reading the Bible.

Daily examination of our conscience at bedtime and asking God's pardon and forgiveness for the sins of the day will also prepare us to face God any time to give Him an account of our lives.

2) We need to attain permanence in a passing world by leading exemplary lives. We must remember that our homes, our Churches, and even our own lives are temporary.

Our greatness is judged by God, not on our worldly achievements, but on our fidelity to our Faith, and our practice of that Faith in loving service of others. How our faithfulness is expressed each day is the most important thing.

We are to persevere in our Faith in spite of worldly temptations, attacks on our religion and moral values by the atheistic or agnostic media, threats of social isolation, and direct or indirect persecution because of our religious beliefs.

Let us conclude this Church year by praying for the grace to endure patiently all our trials, for they are essential to our affirmation of Jesus as our Lord and Savior.

# STOP USING WORDS WRONGLY: IT IS MASS, NOT SERVICE, DISCOVER SOMETHING NEW TODAY!

#### PART 1

#### 1. The Confusion We Often Hear

It happens every day.

You return from Mass, and someone smiles and says, "Father, how was service today?"

Or maybe, "Sister, hope you went to service this morning?"

It sounds polite, but in the Catholic Church, that word service doesn't mean what people think.

Many Catholics, without realizing it, have borrowed a Protestant word and used it in place of a sacred one: the Mass.

But wait, why does this matter? Aren't both "Mass" and "service" just worship?

Let's go deeper.



#### 2. What a "Service" Means

The word "service" is commonly used in Protestant and Evangelical communities to describe their gathering for prayer, preaching, and worship.

A service is a time of fellowship and Scripture reflection, centered on the Word and prayer, but not the Eucharist.

It is a beautiful act of worship, but it does not include the Sacrifice of Christ made present on the altar.

So when our separated brethren say, "Sunday Service," they mean the time they gather to hear the Word, sing, and pray together.

That's why Catholics must be careful. Because what happens in a service and what happens in the Mass are not the same reality.



#### 3. What the "Mass" Really Is

The word Mass comes from the Latin "Missa", meaning "to be sent."

It comes from the final words of the priest: "Ite, missa est", "Go forth, the Mass is ended."

But deeper than the name is the mystery itself.

The Mass is not just a prayer meeting. It is the representation (not a repetition) of the one sacrifice of Jesus Christ on Calvary, made present sacramentally on the altar.

At Mass, heaven touches earth.

Christ, the Eternal High Priest, offers Himself again, not in pain, but in glory, for the salvation of the world. That's why we say the Mass is a sacrifice before it is a service.

It is the highest form of worship possible on earth, because it is Christ Himself who offers and is offered.

So when a Catholic says, "I'm going to Mass," they are saying, "I am going to Calvary, to stand at the foot of the Cross, to witness the saving sacrifice of Christ made present."



# 4. When Can We Say "Service" in the Catholic Church?

Now, it's true that the Church also uses the word service, but in a different sense.

We talk of:

Divine Office or Liturgy of the Hours as a "prayer service."

Funeral service (when no Mass is offered).

Communion service (led by a deacon or lay minister when a priest is absent).

Penitential service, adoration service, or healing service.

So, in Catholic language, "service" means a gathering of prayer without the Eucharistic sacrifice.

But once the Holy Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Christ, is offered on the altar, it ceases to be just a "service."

It becomes the Holy Mass, the Eucharistic Sacrifice.


