### ∞ Parish Vision &

e, the parish community of Immaculate Conception Church, Lihu'e, are called to be Stewards of the Gospel. Centered on the Holy Eucharist, we live our lives on the four pillars of stewardship: hospitality, prayer, formation and service. This is our call.

### ∞ Parish Mission №

R esponding to the call of Jesus and inspired by the example of the Blessed Mother, the Immaculate Conception, we live stewardship towards a holy way of life.

### ∞ Parish Information ∞

Before taking a forward look, it is helpful to understand where we stand today using a story of numbers.


We currently have 826 registered families, up from 667 or about 15% from 5 years ago. Of those that are registered, 268 families received and used the offertory envelopes regularly.

With the Covid19 Pandemic, we were able to gather contact tracing check-in information in every mass to pinpoint more accurately that we have about 557 families actively attending mass on a weekly basis.


Based on our records, we offered only three (3) weekend masses from 2016 to 2018. However, in 2019, we added the 4:30 pm mass on weekends to provide more options for families to attend. Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic that started in March 2020, we added another mass at 6:30 pm for a total of five weekend masses to comply with the social distancing requirements and to accommodate the faithful for the celebration of the Mass.

Mass attendance for the last five years shows a steady growth from 2016 to 2019 with a significant decline in 2020 attributed to the pandemic. Here are the raw numbers:







Figure 2 - 1st Communion and Confirmation in July 2021.

Our Religious Education program had a total of 143 keiki in 2017-2018 and 106 keiki in 2018-2019.


From 2016 to 2018, 124 children and youth received the sacrament of First Communion. However, there were none for 2019 to 2020. For those receiving both First Communion and Confirmation the number totaled 61.

In Graph F, children, youth and adults who received the sacrament of Confirmation numbered at 163. This unusually high number is attributed to preparing and helping all levels receive the sacrament of Confirmation during transitional period, before the restoration of the original order of Confirmation as mandated by the Diocese of Honolulu.






RCIA and Full Communion remained relatively low. Sacramental marriages averaged about 5 per year, with none in 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Baptisms occurred more frequently with an average of 33 per year.

Funerals remained constant at 34 per year. During the course of the Covid-19 pandemic, a greater emphasis was initiated during mass to invite non-regular churchgoers to engage family members to attend mass regularly to pray for deceased loved ones. The overhead projector was also initiated to illustrate the different parts of the Mass to help encourage and inspire non-Catholics to understand and participate actively.





### ∞ Comments on the Numbers ∞

ne of the primary questions after reviewing the numbers is: How do we bring people back to the parish during and after the Covid-19 pandemic? How do we reassure families and visitors that we are following strict safety guidelines and protocols mandated by county and state policies?

The past two years have shown significant drops in Mass attendance, sacramental programs and ministry participation. However, this will change when the Covid-19 pandemic eventually subsides. By continuing with our emphasis on the four pillars of stewardship, we believe that we will be able to move forward, towards a path of normalcy. It is through our strong faith in God, the steadfast and dedicated leadership of our pastor, deacons, religious, and our resilient ministries and programs, that we believe this can be accomplished in the next successive years.

# ∞ Focus of the Five-Year Plan &

All parish goals that we set out to do from 2016-2020 were accomplished with the exception of building more parking lots which we found out was not feasible with our limited land space.

For our next parish pastoral fiveyear plan, we will focus on four areas that the parish has identified as major priorities.

First, we will work on growing our congregation by developing plans to bring back families that have stopped coming to church because of the pandemic or who have left the church entirely.

Investing in our youth, is our second focus. We will continue with the

development and implementation of programs that will engage our youth from middle school to young adults.



Third, we will develop programs that will strengthen our marriage and families, which complements other similar programs already established in Oahu, Maui and Hawaii vicariates.

Finally, our survey indicated that of the 4 pillars of stewardship, parishioners felt that the parish needed to strengthen the pillar of Prayer in their daily lives.

The key to successful implementation of the plan is to continue with the emphasis of the four pillars of stewardship which is integrated into every facet of our programs and ministries.

### ∞ Organization of the Plan ∞

To help us accomplish our goals, our parish pastoral plan will continue to infuse the four pillars of stewardship that we have embraced from the initiative of the Diocese of Honolulu. We will work on helping to build a parish environment where all members come to understand their giftedness, their role as stewards of their gifts and how they can graciously return some of their gifts to God. As disciples of Jesus, members help foster this point of view in all areas of parish life.

We will use the four pillars and indicate to which pillar each plan initiative relates:

- Hospitality: Christian kindness
- Prayer: A heart-to-heart with God
- Formation: Continuous conversion
- Service: Love in action

The plan will also indicate where each initiative aligns into the 2022-2026 Diocesan Pastoral Plan:

- Faith Formation
- Leadership Development of Clergy & Laity
- Strengthening of Marriage & Family Life
- Youth & Young Adult Ministry

In preparing the Parish Pastoral Plan 2022-2026, we conducted a simple parish survey that was initiated in December 2020. The two questions were: 1) What do you think should be the focus for our parish for the next five years? 2) The four Pillars of Stewardship is a way of life and are the foundation of any parish, how would you rank the order the Pillars that Immaculate Conception should focus on?

The Covid-19 Pandemic certainly forced us to think out of the box, and it was determined that using a Survey Monkey platform through a QR code system via smart phones would be the safest and most efficient way to gather survey data information. Those who did not have a smart phone device had the option of completing the survey on paper and pencil.

An approximate total of 108 responses were received in the month of December with the following results:

Respondents indicated that the focus priority should be:

- 1. Bring Parishioners Back/Grow Parish Population
- 2. Invest in Our Youth and Young Adults
- 3. Marriage Life

Regarding the ranking of the Four Pillars of Stewardship, the order of priority is:

- 1. Prayer
- 2. Service
- 3. Hospitality
- 4. Formation

The youth from both middle school and high school were surveyed using QR Code surveys at religious education classes. 16 participants indicated the following priorities with similar results to the general survey to the parishioners.

- 1. Investing in Young Adults
- 2. Bring Back Parishioners

After the survey results were discussed with the Parish Pastoral Council and various Chairs from the Council of Ministries, suggestions for doable action plans, steps, outcomes, assignment of responsibilities, and completion dates were vetted and established for each of the four areas for the next five years.




Figure 7 - Young Adults in action teaching our young people

#### **MARRIAGE AND FAMILY LIFE**

**OBJECTIVE:** Strengthen Marriages and Families

#### **ACTION PLAN 1**

Goal: Develop a ministry focused on families with young children that

will serve to integrate such families more fully into the life of the parish. "Young children" is defined here to mean children too

young for the parish religious education program

**Steps:** a. Find a family with young children to volunteer to lead this

ministry.

b. Set aside one Mass per month dedicated to families with young

children.

c. After each monthly Mass, families with young children will engage in an activity as a group (examples: picnic, beach, games,

park, playground, playgroup).

d. Use baptism preparation as enrollment opportunity.

Outcomes: a. Children and their families get involved in the parish

immediately after baptism.

b. Civil marriages validated in the Church.

c. Faith formation of children begins prior to enrollment in

religious education.

d. Families serving in our liturgical celebration will flourish.

**Responsibility:** Clergy – Pastor and Deacons

**Completion:** 2022-2026

#### **ACTION PLAN 2**

Goal: Conduct or provide workshops to strengthen marriages and for

couples married civilly to have marriages convalidated

**Steps:** a. Invite speakers to help couples deepen their understanding of

their "sacred union."

Outcomes: a. Couples, married in church or not, will be inspired to continue

journeying together with joy and will have the zeal to be real

"teachers of the faith" to their children.

b. Couples who are not married in church will be encouraged to

embrace the Sacrament of Matrimony.
